Day 1 Tuesday, 9 April 2024

Tour Flying in to Christchurch

Welcome to Christchurch, the largest city in New Zealand's South Island. Making your own arrangements to get to Christchurch and to the hotel we have booked in the city, the evening is yours to informally meet and greet your fellow travellers, with dinner at your own arrangements.

Day 2 Wednesday, 10 April 2024

Tour Canterbury Herds & Christchurch City Sights Tour

Breakfast today - and every day - has been arranged and is included. We then board our coach for our day's activities, and make our way to the inland North Canterbury town of Waikari, where we visit the herd of Doug Pitsch. Our next visit is Strathwell, the farm of Ian and Anita Fleming, at Leeston on the Canterbury Plains. We'll enjoy a farm tour and will be hosted for lunch before making our way back to the city for a sightseeing tour. This is a great introduction to Christchurch - also known as the "Garden City" - aboard a classic 1960's London Double Decker bus. From fascinating history to earthquakes, we will see how Christchurch has risen from the ruins and is preserving its heritage while creating a vibrant new city. We'll then make our way back to our hotel, where we enjoy a welcome dinner, and a warm welcome to our fellow members/travellers.

Day 3 Thursday, 11 April 2024

Tour Ashburton Farm and The Frozen Continent

This morning we travel to Ashburton, a large farming town an hour south of Christchurch and where we visit Sarah Elliot's farm. Lunch today is at our own cost and choice in Ashburton's township. After lunch we return to Christchurch to visit one of its premium attractions, the Antarctic Centre. Watch the little blue penguins being fed, pat the huskies in the husky zone, chill out in the storm dome - which replicates a real Antarctic blizzard - and watch a stunning movie in the 4D theatre where you will be thoroughly "immersed" in the frozen continent. We then make our way back to our hotel for a break before heading out this evening for a special dining experience on the Christchurch Tram. Combining colonial style fine dining with inner-city sightseeing on a genuine tram, this is a must-do Christchurch experience.

Tour Flying to Wellington

After breakfast we are transferred to Christchurch Airport to check in for our morning flight to Wellington. Upon arrival in Wellington, we'll make our way to Te Papa Museum of New Zealand where we enjoy a guided tour to discover NZ's rich history and cultures through Te Papa's world-leading exhibitions and treasures. Lunch is at your own cost and choice, and there are two cafes within the museum, or others nearby. Later we'll take a ride on Wellington's Cable Car, an essential experience while in the capital city. As it ascends the Kelburn hillside the cable car travels through three tunnels and over three bridges, and once you've reached the top you'll be rewarded with spectacular views of the city and harbour. Our coach and driver will meet us at the top to take us to our hotel to check in. Dinner this evening is at our own arrangements, with Wellington providing a wide range of options.

Our first visit today though, is Greytown Honey, a fifth-generation family business producing the highest quality manuka, wildflower and clover honey. A tour of the factory (converted racing stables) will be followed by a short tasting session. We then make our way to Martinborough, where we visit Rosemarkie, the farm of Warwick Potts and Helen McKenzie, where we enjoy a farm tour and will be hosted for lunch. This afternoon we make our way to Masterton where we visit Maungahina Hereford Stud, the oldest stud in New Zealand, and where we'll view their Herefords and Speckle Park cattle before making our way to our hotel. This evening we are hosted for dinner at the home of fellow members Judy and Graeme Evans.

This afternoon we will view Priscilla Mudgway's Whiskey Creek herd before arriving mid-afternoon into our Palmerston North hotel. We have allowed a little free time for catching up on the washing, and a bit of time out. Dinner is at your own arrangements this evening.

Day 8 Tuesday, 16 April 2024

Tour In Palmerston North

This morning we travel out to Massey University Campus. Massey has grown from a small agricultural college established in Palmerston North in the late 1800's to become one of New Zealand's largest universities, while still specialising in agricultural, horticultural and veterinary studies. We'll return to town for lunch, before we visit the New Zealand Rugby Museum, the world's first museum dedicated to the oval ball. Explore the rich history of New Zealand's national game, and discover the stories, legends and myths. This evening we enjoy a good old-fashioned roast at the Palmerston North Cosmopolitan Club.

Day 9 Wednesday, 17 April 2024

Tour Palmerston North to Rotorua

After breakfast we are on the road bright and early this morning, travelling through scenic North Island countryside. This includes the Desert Road, where weather permitting, you'll see the spectacular sight of NZ's volcanic trio - Mounts Ruapehu, Ngauruhoe and Tongariro. We make our way to Taupo, a vibrant and scenic town located on the shores of the lake of the same name, and which will be our lunch stop today. After lunch we visit Huka Falls. You'll hear them before you see them – it's the sound of nearly a quarter of a million litres of water per second thundering 11m into the Waikato River below. This incredible waterfall is the most-visited natural attraction in New Zealand. We then make our way to Kitenui Deer Farm, where our host Murray Matuschka will take us "on safari" across his rolling property, where he farms red deer, but also runs other deer species, as well as a small herd of Himalayan tahr.



Our destination today is Rotorua, the geothermal capital of New Zealand. Dinner tonight is at our own choice, but our driver will provide a transfer to “Eat Street” a bustling hub boasting a dozen or so restaurants and bars, with a covered central walkway the focal point for this all-weather al fresco dining area.

Day 10 **Thursday, 18 April 2024**

Tour **Discovering Rotorua**

Rotorua is the birthplace of tourism in New Zealand and today is set aside for you to experience it by visiting some of the city’s most iconic attractions. This morning we visit Te Puia Geothermal Park where we take a guided tour of this 60 hectare landscape of natural bush, steaming vents, bubbling mud pools and spurting geysers, including the world famous Pohutu Geyser. History, culture, geology and conservation unite in this unique setting. Returning to town, lunch is at our own choice and cost before we make our way to Skyline Gondola Rotorua. The 900-metre long cableway system will transport you on a gentle, scenic ride up to the Skyline Rotorua complex. While enjoying spectacular views of Lake Rotorua and the city, you can taste local wines, check out the jellybean sculptures at Jelly Belly or enjoy a coffee at one of the cafes. We will then take a drive out to Lake Tarawera – renowned for the eruption of Mount Tarawera in the 1880’s which destroyed the famous Pink and White Terraces. We will also pass by several other small scenic lakes, including the Blue and Green Lakes, before returning to our hotel to relax and freshen up for our evening out at Te Pa Tu Maori Village. Wrap up warm, as some of this evening’s activities will be outdoors. Voted one of the top 10 experiences in the world, we enjoy a traditional Māori welcome ceremony, an interactive tour of a pre-European village, participate in hands-on cultural activities, and a traditional dinner. This will be an entertaining night to remember.

Day 11 **Friday, 19 April 2024**

Tour **Hobbiton and Whangamata**

We’re on the road again today, travelling to Hobbiton, located on rolling farmland in the Waikato countryside. Hobbiton is the filming location of the Shire, as seen in the Lord of the Rings and The Hobbit Trilogies and where we enjoy a guided tour of the film set. We will journey around the 12 acre set; past Hobbit Holes, the Mill and into the world-famous Green Dragon Inn, where lunch will be served.



Our travels continue this afternoon to Waihi, a historic gold mining town known as “the town with a heart of gold” – a working gold mine literally in the centre of the town. We have a chance to take a walk to the Cornish pumphouse, a landmark building in the town, which also provides views of the mine pit.

Our destination today is Whangamata, a seaside town in the Coromandel region. Whangamata has a scenic harbour and great beaches, popular with surfers. After settling into our accommodation, we will head to the local RSA for dinner this evening.

Day 12 Saturday, 20 April 2024

Tour Bridson Herd and an Organic Dairy Farm

This morning our travels take us to Opoutere, where we visit Coromandel's only herd, owned by Allan and Helen Bridson. With a stop enroute for lunch, our destination today is Cambridge, where this afternoon we visit an organic dairy farm. Here we meet committed young couple Jesiah and Ellen Alexander, who are milking a mixed herd of mainly shorthorn and Ayrshire cows, on lush Waikato pastures. We stay in the charming village of Cambridge for the next two nights, our accommodation just a short distance away from a small lake that offers a pleasant walk. Dinner has been arranged at our hotel this evening.

Day 13 Sunday, 21 April 2024

Tour The Mighty Waikato

This morning we express through to Hamilton, Waikato's principal city, where we visit the Ruakura Agricultural Research Centre. AgResearch is one of seven Crown Research Institutes in New Zealand and is responsible for delivering science and research outcomes specifically for the agricultural sector. We then make our way out to Gordonton to Woodlands Estate, where we enjoy lunch at the Garden Grove Café, and afterwards a chance to take a look through the beautiful Woodlands Homestead, a category 1 Historic Place with Heritage NZ. You can also enjoy a wander of the extensive park-like gardens surrounding the homestead. This afternoon we enjoy a wander at Hamilton Gardens, discovering some of the themed gardens that are a unique feature of this wonderful green space. Look for the Italian Renaissance Garden, the Victorian Flower Garden, the Tropical Garden, or wander through the productive gardens. There are more than 20 themes to choose from. Returning to Cambridge, dinner is at your own arrangements this evening, with options nearby or inhouse.

Tour Travelling to Auckland

We travel through to Auckland this morning, where we have arranged a visit to SkyCity Tower. At 328 metres (1,076 ft) tall, from ground level to the top of the mast, Sky Tower is the second tallest freestanding structure in the Southern Hemisphere. Since its completion in 1997 the Sky Tower has become an iconic landmark in Auckland's skyline, due to its height and design. Needless to say the sky deck offers unsurpassed 360 degree views of Auckland City, Waitemata Harbour and the ancient volcanoes that dot the city landscape. We will then be dropped down at Viaduct Harbour for lunch and some free time to explore Auckland's waterfront.

Later this afternoon we board the coach again for a scenic drive out along the harbour to Bastion Point and Mission Bay, taking in Auckland Domain and other city landmarks. Checking into our hotel for our last night together, we dine in this evening, with the opportunity to enjoy each other's company and reminisce on our own personal tour favourites.

Conditions and Important Booking Information

Tranzit Coachlines (Wairarapa) Ltd, trading as Tranzit Tours Terms and Conditions and Important Booking Information

Before you book a tour with Tranzit Tours, please take the time to read and understand these Terms and Conditions below.

Pricing Validity

- All costs associated with each tour are outlined in full within each tour itinerary. All pricing quoted is valid for the dates of tour when booked.

Reservations and Payments

- Bookings for all Tranzit tours can be made through any Tranzit Coachlines Reservations Centre or an approved Travel Agent.
- Any person making a booking for others shall be deemed to have accepted these Terms and Conditions on behalf of all individuals they are booking on a tour and it is the responsibility of the person making the booking to bring these Terms and Conditions to the attention of those individuals booked.
- A deposit as stated in the Tour Itinerary is payable to secure the booking.
- The balance must be paid in full by the date stated in the Tour Itinerary.
- Any reservation made within fourteen (14) days of the tour departure must be paid in full at the time of booking.

Cancellations, Postponements and Alterations

Cancellations by the Customer

- Cancellations 45+ days before tour departure date – a cancellation fee valued at 15% of your deposit, plus any other fees charged by other providers such as accommodation, ferry, activities etc.
- Cancellations 44 – 8 days before tour departure date – a cancellation fee valued at 15% of the total tour cost, plus any other fees charged by other providers such as accommodation, ferry, activities etc.
- Cancellations within 7 days before tour departure date – a cancellation fee valued at 25% of the total tour cost, plus any other fees charged by other providers such as accommodation, ferry, activities etc.
- No refunds will be made for cancellations made within one day of departure or once travel has commenced. Refunds will not be provided for unused portions of a tour, unless the Customer can provide genuine reason and documentary evidence that services were unable to be utilised (and a refund if applicable is available from the other provider) in which case the company will review each request and may provide a partial refund at the sole discretion of the company.
- Cancellations of one half of a twin share booking will result in the Customer cancelling being charged the cost of a single booking, if the Company is unable to match the twin share booking with another Customer.

Alterations by the Customer

- The Customer may transfer their booking to another person for the same tour and commencement date, but only if the other person satisfies all of Tranzit Tours requirements in relation to the tour and provides us a completed Booking Form. The Customer must notify Tranzit Tours in writing of the intended transfer at least 30 days prior to the commencement date of the tour. A \$60 transfer fee per person/per transfer will apply (in addition to any supplier change fees).

Cancellations or Postponements by the Company

- Tranzit Tours reserves the right to cancel, reschedule or postpone a tour. With the exception of the Force Majeure section below, Tranzit Tours will:
- In the event of a tour being cancelled by the company prior to departure and not postponed – refund the total amount paid in respect of that tour or provide a credit, but will have no further liability to the Customer.
- In the event of a tour being postponed – rebook the Customer for the new departure date or provide a credit, but will have no further liability to the Customer.
- In the event of a Force Majeure event that occurs prior to, or during, a tour such as but not limited to fire, flood, volcanic eruption, earthquake, avalanche, severe weather, power outages, labour disruptions, pandemic, government controls or other events outside Tranzit Tours control that interrupts the ability to operate the tour in full or in part, or if Tranzit Tours determines that the quality of the tour or the health and safety of the Customer would be compromised, Tranzit Tours reserves the right to cancel, postpone, or shorten the tour and will be excused and released from its obligations without liability of any kind. Customers will receive a credit for postponed tours. For cancelled or shortened tours, refunds in these circumstances will be in full less any unrecoverable costs (i.e. expenses already incurred or fees charged by other providers).
- The Customer will be advised of any increased tour costs as a result of the postponement. Credits will be equal to the value of the payment made and must be used within 12 months. Customers are strongly advised to take out travel insurance.
- In the event of cancellation or postponement by the company, Tranzit Tours is not responsible for any consequential loss incurred by the Customer. Customers are again advised to take out travel insurance.

Alterations by the Company

- Before Tour Commencement: If a major change to the tour needs to be made before departure, we will inform the Customer of the change as soon as practicable and will advise of any consequential price increase or decrease.

- Transit Tours reserves the right to alter a tour (including the itinerary) and substitute accommodation facilities should unforeseen circumstances beyond our control make changes necessary. Whilst every effort is made to adhere to the itinerary as provided, the company reserves the right to alter the touring and attractions as dictated by circumstances and conditions outside the company's control. Alterations may be made to ensure the smooth running of the tour. Every attempt will be made to ensure alterations do not adversely affect the operation of the tour. The company will not be held responsible for weather-based cancellations, or those closures made at the tour provider's discretion.
- Transit Tours will inform the customer as soon as practicable and will advise of any consequential price increase or decrease.

Insurance

- Transit Tours recommend that you purchase comprehensive travel insurance to cover against things like lost or damaged luggage, accident or sickness, loss or theft of personal belongings and documents, or the need to cancel or shorten your tour. Please note that special conditions will apply for pre-existing medical conditions with all travel insurance policies.

Health and Fitness

- Transit Tours are generally able to accommodate most fitness abilities; however, some tours may require a certain level of physical fitness for full enjoyment of tour activities. The Customer must inform Transit Tours, at the time of booking, of any health or fitness restrictions that may limit participation of tour activities or put the Customer, tour staff or other customers at risk. The Customer acknowledges that their suitability for a tour, or any activity within a tour, is wholly the Customer's responsibility.
- Payment of a deposit by the Customer to secure a Transit Tour acts as a warranty that:
 - the Customer is reasonably healthy and/or fit to participate in the tour, and
 - the Customer does not have a health, physical condition or disability that would create risk to themselves, tour staff or other customers, and
 - the Customer indemnifies Transit Tours from all actions, claims and demands arising out of any want of health or fitness.
- Transit Tours reserves the right to decline a booking on medical, health or fitness grounds at its sole discretion.
- Transit Tours reserves the right to remove a Customer from a tour, or quarantine a Customer on tour, if their health and/or fitness interferes with the tour or staff safety or other Customers safety or tour experience in any way. Any additional costs associated with a Customer's removal from tour or placement into quarantine, shall be borne by the Customer. Refunds will be made in accordance with these Terms and Conditions.

Authority on Tour

- Transit Tours are operated by staff with decision making authority while on tour. By travelling with Transit Tours, you agree to accept the authority of the driver/guide and their decisions are final in all matters likely to affect the wellbeing, safety or experience of any customer or staff member on board. Failure to adhere to reasonable requests or any inappropriate behaviour that is degrading the experience of other customers, may result in the Customer being removed from the tour. If a Customer is asked to leave a tour, any costs associated with returning home will be borne by the Customer and any unused portion of the tour will not be refunded.

Responsibilities

- Transit Tours include goods and services provided by other operators such as hotels, attractions and transportation companies. Customers are advised to familiarise themselves with the terms and conditions on which these services are supplied. Accordingly, Transit Tours will not be responsible and will be excluded from liability for any loss, damage, omission or acts being negligent or otherwise, committed by other goods and service providers used in connection with the tour.
- Transit Tours is not liable for any loss, damage, delay, or injury caused to the traveller or their baggage whilst under the care or control of a third-party provider. A Customer's baggage and personal effects shall be carried at the owner's risk as provided for under the Carriage of Goods Act.
- Transit Tours is not responsible for any losses or additional expenses to the Customer due to tours impacted by Force Majeure events that occur prior to, or during, a tour such as but not limited to fire, flood, volcanic eruption, earthquake, avalanche, severe weather, power outages, labour disruptions, pandemic, government controls or other events outside Transit Tours control that interrupts the ability to operate the tour in full or in part, or if Transit Tours determines that the quality of the tour or the health and safety of the Customer would be compromised.

Acceptance of Risk

- The Customer acknowledges that all Transit Tours may be subject to risks and dangers beyond that which might be experienced by the Customer at home. Except as provided in law, the Customer acknowledges that they assume all risk and Transit Tours is not liable for misadventure, death, injury, delay or loss which occurs during the tour.

Seat Rotation

- For the enjoyment of all travellers Transit Tours operates a seat rotation system which all travellers must participate in as a condition of booking.

Photographs

- Photographs used to market any Transit Tour depict typical scenes experienced, but the subject matter may not necessarily be seen or experienced whilst visiting a destination within a tour.
- Whilst on tour, the Customer may be included in photographs and/or film taken by the guide or driver. These

photographs may be used for future promotional advertising purposes and by booking on a Transit Tour the Customer authorises the use of any images they are captured in to be used without further consent or any payment of any kind. If the Customer does not authorise the use of their image for promotional purposes, they must make this known at the time of booking.

Privacy Policy
